


Proportional Signed Line Calculations


- **Intro.** When proportionally signing down lines, brokers have the option to specify a number of decimal places. This gives brokers the flexibility to simplify line calculations for oversubscribed risks which result in line percentages with many decimal places, or to maintain up to 7 decimal places.
- When the number of decimals is set to 'auto', the platform will sign lines down proportionally up to 4 decimal places.

Any positive remainder from the calculation will be assigned to the leader or first carrier to write a line if no leader is present. Any negative remainder will be subtracted from the line of the last carrier to apply their stamp.



2. Brokers can specify the number of decimals to which lines should be signed. Any remainder from this calculation will be assigned as described in step 1.


> Brokers can manually select to sign lines with up to 7 decimal places.

3. This contract [right] has been proportionally signed to 1 decimal place.

N.B. Where Line to Stand is selected by the underwriter or broker, the line will be unaffected by the proportional signing calculation.



Where an underwriter has written a line with decimal places, this will also be unaffected by the calculation unless manually edited by the broker.
